
"Inspiration" Lecture and Trunk Show ~~ 10 AM

I share how I got the idea to make each one; along with the strategies I use throughout my process to stay organized, get things finished, and have fun while doing it. I share why I made the design decisions that I made. I hope to help you see the world around you with fresh eyes and get inspired by so much more than just other quilts. I love hearing from those who have seen my program; that I inspired them and made them feel like they could do it!



A-Maze-ing Workshop ~~~ 1:00 – 4:00 pm

This quilt started out as a variation on a jelly roll race. It will give participants practice on measuring and attaching borders. You can use it to make a very contemporary quilt quickly, but also works well with traditional fabric classic look. Supply List for A Maze Zing -- My quilt is 48" by 70"

For the whole quilt: I used the equivalent of (27) 2 ½" strips that are 40" long. For variety, I cut all of my strips in half. You may want to wait to do that until we discuss it in class, but I would say it is unnecessary for your strips to be selvage to selvage. I think anything a foot or longer will work, so if you have leftover partial strips, they will work just fine.

(32) strips that are $1\frac{1}{2}$ wide, and $40^{"}$ long, or an equivalent amount of fabric.

Sewing machine, threaded with your regular piecing thread

Pins

Ruler (if your strips are already cut, you won't need a large one)

Tape measure (I found it useful to use a 120" tape measure, once my quilt got larger than 60" on a side, but we may not get that far during class, so a 60" tape measure will work for much of it)

Rotary cutter and mat

Marking pencils that will show up well on all of your fabrics Scissors
